STATEMENT IN THE PARLIAMENT BY THE HONOURABLE KENNETH BRYAN MINISTER OF TOURISM, AND TRANSPORT

STATEMENT ON SECTION 11 (5) APPROPRIATIONS: 2021 October 2021

Mr. Speaker, I rise to make a Statement in accordance with Section 11 (6) of the Public Management and Finance Act, in relation to the Section 11 (5) appropriations during the 2021 fiscal year.

- 11. (5) Where an exceptional circumstance has occurred during a financial year, the Cabinet may authorise executive financial transactions for which no appropriation exists if —
- (a) the executive financial transactions directly relate to, and attempt to remedy the effects of, the exceptional circumstance; and
- (b) the total amount authorised is no more than five per cent of budgeted executive revenue for the financial year.

1 January to 14 April 2021

Mister Speaker, TP 67 Sports and Cultural Tourism Programmes Assistance was increased by \$27M in order to assist with providing financial assistance to displaced tourism employees that have been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic and the resulting closure of the Cayman Islands Borders.

14 April Onwards

The appropriation TP 67 Sports and Cultural Tourism Programmes Assistance was increased by \$2M in order to assist with providing financial assistance to displaced tourism employees that have been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic and the resulting closure of the Cayman Islands Borders. This increase was funded by a decrease in DAT 15 Tourism Advertising Activities, Marketing, Public Relations, Sales and Promotions.

Mister Speaker, NGS 7 Management of Small Business Development was increased by \$110,000 in order to assist with providing financial assistance to the Stingray Feeding and Interaction Programme. This increase was funded by

a decrease in the same amount in DAT 16 Support for Local Tourism Providers and Public Education Programmes.

The appropriation TAB 1 Management of Pedro St. James National Historic Site was increased by \$100,000 in order to assist with the shortfall between expenses and revenues that have been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic and the resulting closure of the Cayman Islands Borders. This increase was funded by a decrease in the same amount in DAT 16 Support for Local Tourism Providers and Public Education Programmes.

Mister Speaker, TAB 2 Management of Queen Elizabeth II Botanic Park was increased by \$340,000 in order to assist with the shortfall between expenses and revenues that have been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic and the resulting closure of the Cayman Islands Borders. This increase was funded by a decrease in the same amount in DAT 16 Support for Local Tourism Providers and Public Education Programmes.

The appropriation TP 67 Sports and Cultural Tourism Programmes Assistance was increased by \$5.4M in order to assist with providing financial assistance to displaced

tourism employees that have been affected by the Covid-19 pandemic and the resulting closure of the Cayman Islands Borders. This increase was funded by a decrease in the same amount in EA 85 Ministry of Home Affairs.

Mister Speaker, the COVID-19 Pandemic is an event that was unforeseen and could not have been planned for. And, as such, Mister Speaker, I believe that these COVID-19 related expenses, just mentioned, meet the threshold of exceptional circumstances as outlined in the Public Management and Finance Act.
