PRIVATE MEMBER'S MOTION NO. 2/2021-2022

Motion on Removal of Import Duty on Essential Products

WHEREAS the COVID-19 Pandemic has caused an economic downturn and economic hardships across the globe, including the Cayman Islands where the estimated contraction in Real Gross Domestic Product in 2020 was 6.7%;

AND WHEREAS because of the pandemic in 2020 the estimated unemployment rate was the highest in these Islands since 2013, with Overall Unemployment estimated at 5.2%, but unemployment among Caymanians estimated at 8.3%;

AND WHEREAS the cost of goods and fuel has not only increased significantly, but are expected to rise further due to the impact of the pandemic and related issues;

AND WHEREAS it is important that the Government assist in lowering the costs of essential imported products to benefit families;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that the Government consider as a matter of urgency conducting a review of Government import duties and removing import duty from products such as medicines, disposable diapers, baby food and formula, feminine hygiene and sanitary products, and birth control products.
