**AND WHEREAS** the Private Members' Motions passed during the current Term dealt with issues which were considered to be of significant importance to the people of the Cayman Islands;

**AND WHEREAS** the importance of Private Members' Motions as a means to raise and debate issues not on the Government's agenda and to give a voice to issues which are important to the electorate was recognized and established in the reform of the UK Parliament through the Wright Committee in 2009;

**BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED THAT** the Government consider providing a report to the Legislative Assembly during the current Meeting of the House, on the progress made to implement the Private Members' Motions which have been passed during this current Term.
