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**ELECTORAL DISTRICT BOUNDARIES ORDER,
2024**

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 89(6) of the Constitution, the Governor makes the following Order —

WHEREAS an Electoral Boundary Commission was appointed on 4th January, 2023 under section 88 of the Constitution set out in Schedule 2 to the Cayman Islands Constitution Order 2009, S.I. 2009 No. 1379 as amended (in this Order referred to as “the Constitution”);

AND WHEREAS under section 89(1) of the Constitution, the Electoral Boundary Commission is charged with responsibility for reviewing the boundaries of the electoral districts into which the Cayman Islands are divided and submitting a report to the Governor and the Parliament containing its recommendations for any changes in the number and boundaries of the electoral districts;

AND WHEREAS in accordance with section 89(1) of the Constitution, the Electoral Boundary Commission, on 4th August 2023, submitted to the Governor and the Parliament a report making recommendations for the retention of all electoral districts;

AND WHEREAS the Electoral Boundary Commission recommended that the nineteen electoral districts be renamed;

AND WHEREAS the report also included an alternative recommendation for twenty electoral districts;

AND WHEREAS the Electoral Boundary Commission recommended that the electoral district boundaries, with the exception of North Side and East End, be adjusted;

AND WHEREAS the recommended names of the nineteen electoral districts and the estimated population sizes are set out in Schedule A of the report;

AND WHEREAS the precise boundaries of the nineteen electoral districts are set out in Schedules B and C of the report;

AND WHEREAS it is provided by section 89(3) of the Constitution that as soon as may be after the Electoral Boundary Commission has submitted a report under section 89(1), the Premier shall lay before the Parliament for its approval the draft of an Order by the Governor for giving effect, whether with or without modifications, to the recommendations contained in the report;

AND WHEREAS a draft of this Order giving effect to the recommendations contained in the report of the Electoral Boundary Commission was laid before the Parliament for its approval by the Premier on [date] and was approved by resolution of the Parliament on [date];

NOW, THEREFORE, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 89(6) of the Constitution, the Governor makes the following Order —

Citation and commencement

1. (1) This Order may be cited as the Electoral District Boundaries Order, 2024.
- (2) This Order comes into force upon the next dissolution of the Parliament.

Electoral districts and representatives

2. (1) The Cayman Islands shall be divided into the following nineteen electoral districts —
 - (a) West Bay 1
 - (b) West Bay 2
 - (c) West Bay 3
 - (d) West Bay 4
 - (e) George Town 1
 - (f) George Town 2
 - (g) George Town 3
 - (h) George Town 4
 - (i) George Town 5
 - (j) George Town 6
 - (k) George Town 7
 - (l) Bodden Town 1
 - (m) Bodden Town 2

- (n) Bodden Town 3
 - (o) Bodden Town 4
 - (p) North Side
 - (q) East End
 - (r) Cayman Brac 1
 - (s) Cayman Brac 2 & Little Cayman
- (2) The boundaries of each electoral district shall be as set out in Schedules B and C of the Report of the Electoral Boundary Commission that was submitted to the Governor and the Parliament on 4th August 2023.
- (3) Each electoral district shall be represented in the Parliament by one elected member.
