Mister Speaker, I would like to congratulate and recognize Jordan Crooks, Jillian Crooks and Kyra Rabess on a successful and outstanding representation at these Championships. Jillian and Kyra both set new National and CIASA records. Jillian setting a new record in the 100m Freestyle with a time of 54.13 and Kyra who won the 400m heat in time of 4.14.77 and in the 800m Freestyle with a time 8.46.13. To Jillian and Kyra, I am

delighted to extend congratulations to both of you for a job well done. We are all looking forward to seeing your continued growth in the sport.

On Saturday 14 December 2024, we watched Jordan as he demolished the 50m freestyle short course world record twice in less 24 hours. Then on Sunday, 15 December, Jordan went on to win gold in the 50m Freestyle with a time of 20.19.
