1. INTRODUCTION

The Standing Business Committee was established by the Parliament Standing Orders, 2025 on the 3rd February, 2025.

The Parliament Standing Orders, Order 96 provides that:

- (1) *The Speaker shall convene a Business Committee at the commencement of each Parliament and the Speaker shall be the chairperson of the Business Committee.*
- (2) *The Business Committee consists of three members of the Government appointed by the Premier and two members for the Opposition. One member from the Opposition shall be appointed by the Leader of the Opposition and the other member shall be appointed by the other members of the Opposition. If the members of the Opposition are unable to agree on the appointment of a member from among themselves, the Speaker shall appoint such member.*
- (3) *The Business Committee may also meet, and make determinations, by electronic means, including remote participation.*
- (4) *The Business Committee shall determine how the business of the House will be ordered in a specified sitting in accordance with these Standing Orders and the following matters shall be considered –*
 - (a) that the hours of a specified sitting day be adjusted;*
 - (b) the arrangement of business will to be transacted in the House;*
 - (c) when business will be transacted in the House;*
 - (d) that any two or more items may be taken together for the purpose of debate; and*
 - (e) any other matters delegated to the Committee under the Standing Orders.*



1. **Meeting to Order**

The Chairman welcomed and thanked the Honourable Members for attending the Meeting. There being a quorum present, the Chairman brought the meeting to order at 2:13pm.

2. **Apologies**

There were no apologies recorded as all Members were present.

3. **Approval of Minutes and Report**

The Report of the Standing Business Committee – Third Meeting of the 2024-2025 Session of the Cayman Islands Parliament, which included the Minutes of 29th January, 2025 together with two Round Robins, were reviewed and approved on a motion moved by Hon. Deputy Leader of the Opposition and seconded by Hon. Premier.

The Committee **agreed** that the Report be laid on the Table of the House during the First Meeting of the 2025 - 2026 Session of Parliament.

4. **Approval of House Business**

The Chairman reminded Members that this Meeting was a State Opening and would include a Throne speech by Her Excellency, the Governor.

The Committee considered Business Papers 1 through 7 and agreed to the following:

The Chairman advised the Committee that ten reports as listed on Business Papers 2, 4, 5 and 7 were received for tabling. The Committee agreed that these ten reports were to be placed on the Order Paper for Wednesday 25th June, 2025. If any further reports were received, these would be circulated to the Honourable Members and approved via round-robin and tabled for Friday, 27th June, 2025. The Committee agreed that Pastor Alson Ebanks would say prayers.

First Sitting – Wednesday 25th June, 2025

Prayers: Prayers by Pastor Alson Ebanks.

Reports: The Committee agreed that all 10 Reports be placed on the Order Paper.

Government Business:

Bills: The Committee agreed that the Bills would be tabled for First Readings on Wednesday, 25th June, 2025 in the following order:

4. Public Service Management (Amendment) Bill, 2025

A discussion ensued on the Virtual Asset (Service Providers) (Amendment), Bill, 2025 and the Public Service Management (Amendment) Bill, 2025. It was confirmed to Hon. Deputy Leader of Opposition that two power point presentations would be circulated with the Opposition to clarify the Bills.

Questions: The Chairman advised that there were twenty (20) questions listed on Business Papers 3 & 5 and the Premier was to ensure that answers to the questions would be received by 10:00am in order to be placed on the Order Paper.

The Committee agreed that the Parliamentary Questions were to be laid before the House in the following order:

5. DRAFT Programme for the State Opening on 26th June, 2025

The Committee considered the Draft Programme for the State Opening and noted changes to the contents. A discussion ensued on the various amendments and to the Programme.

The Chairman reminded Members that after the departure of Her Excellency, the Governor, fifteen minutes would be set-aside for the official photograph. Individual official photographs would be taken between 12:00 – 1:30pm. Lunch would also be served during these hours.

6. Other Business

The Chairman gave a brief summary of a new Initiative under READING BY THE HONOURABLE SPEAKER OF MESSAGES AND ANNOUNCEMENTS. The purpose being to recognize Caymanian students and encourage their interest in Parliament. All Members were encouraged to bring a Head Boy or Head Girl from their respective constituency to the Parliament at the First Meeting. He advised that where a member didn't have a Government Primary School in their respective constituency, the Member could bring 2 adults from the community.

The Speaker also acknowledged that the Member for Bodden Town West had sent his apologies and he would not attend the State Opening.

A discussion ensued regarding Caymanian students who attended private schools and their participation in this Initiative. There was also the concern that some students from the Government Primary Schools could not attend due to graduations. It was proposed that where a student could not attend due to a graduation, the student would be recognized by mentioning the student's name.

A discussion also ensued regarding obituaries and a specific meeting day to be assigned for all obituaries. The Committee agreed that as Obituaries and Ceremonial Speeches was a permanent item on the Order Paper, Members could utilize the time to give condolences to Members in their respective constituencies and that Thursday, 26th June, 2025 and Friday, 27th June, 2025 would be set aside for obituaries for the this First Meeting.

There being no other business the meeting adjourned at 3:20 pm.
