1. INTRODUCTION

The Parliament appointed the Standing Business Committee with the passing on 3rd February, 2025 of Government Motion No. 9 and resolved that –

“In accordance with the provisions of Standing Order 96, this House appoints a Standing Business Committee charged with deciding the order of business of the House and, in particular –

- (a) the hours of a specified sitting day be adjusted;*
- (b) the arrangement of business to be transacted;*
- (c) when business will be transacted in the House;*
- (d) that any two or more items of business may be transacted in the House;*

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Standing Business Committee shall comprise of the Speaker who shall be the Chairman and three Elected Members of the Government appointed by the Premier and two members for the Opposition. One Member from the Opposition shall be appointed by the Leader of the Opposition and the other member by the other members of the Opposition;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the quorum for the Committee shall be four Members of the Committee including the Chairman and that the Committee shall meet at such times as called by the Chairman;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Committee review its terms of reference and report any recommendations to this Honourable House.

The Motion was moved by the Deputy Governor the Honourable Ex Officio Member responsible for the Portfolio of the Civil Service.





Reference

The purpose of the meeting was to approve the Business of the House for the Second Meeting of the 2025-2026 Session of the Parliament commencing Wednesday, 15th October, 2025.

1. Meeting to Order

Chairman welcomed and thanked the Honourable Members for attending the Meeting. There being a quorum present, the Chairman brought the meeting to order at 10:40am.

2. Apologies

There were no apologies recorded as all Members were present.

3. Approval of Minutes and Report

- i. The Minutes of Thursday, 19th June, 2025 were reviewed by the Members.

The Minutes of the 19th June, 2025 were approved on a motion by Hon. Premier and seconded by Hon. Rolston Anglin.

- ii. The Report of the Standing Business Committee – First Meeting of the 2025-2026 Session of the Cayman Islands Parliament, which included the Minutes of 19th June, 2025 was reviewed and approved on a motion moved by Hon. Premier and seconded by Hon. Katherine Ebanks-Wilks.

The Committee **agreed** that the Report be laid on the Table of the House during the Second Meeting of the 2025-2026 Session of Parliament.

4. Approval of House Business

The Committee considered and approved Business Papers 1 through 8.

- (e) any capital expenditure and maintenance, and stating the percentage that total Early Childhood Education spending represented of the Government's overall education budget in each year?

No. 28: Can the Honourable Minister confirm whether Government will consider:

- (b) linking support to household income and average preschool fees, to ensure assistance reflects both family circumstances and the real cost of care?
