QUESTION:

Can the Honourable Minister say:

- (a) what is the actual percentage of self-sufficiency in the Cayman Islands in egg production;
- (b) how many local producers of eggs do we have; and
- (c) how many eggs per week are produced?

ANSWER:

Mr Speaker, based on 2025 data, the level of self-sufficiency in local egg production is approximately 53%.

There are 106 egg producers in the Cayman Islands.

Local production is approximately 164,346 eggs per week, equivalent to 13,696 dozen eggs.

The focus remains on supporting local production, including encouraging demand for locally produced eggs.
