**Statement in relation to an Exceptional Circumstance
Appropriation: National CCTV Program Services**

STATEMENT

Mister Speaker,

I rise to make a statement to this Honourable House in accordance with section 11(6) of the Public Management and Finance Act (2026 Revision) regarding an exceptional circumstance appropriation approved by Cabinet.

Mister Speaker,

Cabinet has authorised this transaction pursuant to section 11(5) of the Act, which provides for executive financial transactions in circumstances that could not reasonably have been anticipated, that are beyond the control of the Cabinet, and that require timely intervention in the national interest.

This matter concerns the continued advancement of the National CCTV Programme, which is a critical security and public safety asset of the Cayman Islands.

The Government has taken a deliberate and strategic decision to pursue a targeted expansion of this programme in order to strengthen community safety, enhance situational awareness, and ensure more equitable public safety coverage across our districts.

Mister Speaker,

The National CCTV Programme and related network

infrastructure is overseen by the Ministry of District Administration and Home Affairs and administered by the Department of Public Safety Communications. It plays an essential role in supporting law enforcement through real-time monitoring, evidentiary capture, and coordinated response capability.

In this instance, Cabinet's determination was informed by consultation and technical assessment, including engagement between the Department of Public Safety Communications and the Royal Cayman Islands Police Service (RCIPS), to ensure that the proposed expansion would deliver maximum operational impact and public safety benefit.

Through this process, a gap in coverage in the eastern districts was identified, particularly in areas experiencing increased traffic movement, community activity, and evolving public safety risks. Addressing this gap could not be deferred without consequence to public safety outcomes.

Accordingly, Cabinet approved the targeted expansion of the network, comprising the installation of thirty new CCTV cameras across strategically identified locations within Bodden Town and North Side, together with the establishment of a dedicated monitoring station at the North Side Police Station.

Mister Speaker,

Having regard to the risks presented, Cabinet further determined that the most appropriate and responsible course of action was to reallocate funding within the existing 2026 Budget, rather than increase overall expenditure.

On 1 April 2026, Cabinet therefore approved the transfer of appropriations in the amount of one hundred and sixty-five thousand Cayman Islands dollars (CI\$165,000) by reducing EA 168 – Infrastructure and Development, and increasing EI 93 – Ministry of District Administration and Home Affairs, to facilitate this expansion.

Mister Speaker,

In accordance with the Act, I further advise this Honourable House that the authorised executive financial transaction is CI\$165,000 in capital expenditure, and that this reallocation has no adverse impact on the Government's overall financial position, as it is funded entirely through the reallocation of existing appropriations within the same expenditure category.

This decision remains fully consistent with the principles of responsible financial management, including maintaining fiscal discipline while responding decisively to priority national risks.

Mister Speaker,

This action reflects a broader and ongoing commitment by this

Government to modernise and strengthen our national security infrastructure, ensuring that our communities are safe, our law enforcement agencies are properly supported, and our public safety systems are resilient, responsive, and fit for purpose.

It is a clear demonstration that where national security and public safety needs are identified, this Government will act decisively, responsibly, and collectively to address them.
